Session #3 is part of a three-session series, the sessions each being 3.0 hours, and is intended for business owners and professionals seeking to better understand the legal issues and operating requirements that a new business encounters. Participants can attend one, two or all three sessions.

- Compare various types of intellectual property, and what protections they provide
- Associate copyright law with protections needed by businesses
- List exceptions permitted under the "fair use" doctrine and apply fair use concepts to copyright protection
- List types of copyright damages and differentiate the circumstances as to when they apply
- Associate trademark law with protections needed by businesses
- Compare international trademark protections and U.S. trademarks
- Associate patent law with protections needed by businesses
- Compare trade secrets with other forms of intellectual property
- Differentiate patents and trade secrets
- Distinguish between employees and independent contractors, list classification requirements of each and the tests that apply, and understand the consequences of misclassification
- Apply intellectual property ownership protections in the context of independent contractor relationships
- Differentiate between offer letters and employment agreements
- Utilize proprietary information and inventions agreements
- Utilize noncompetition agreements and identify restrictions on use
- Apply the uniform Commercial Code to contract matters; distinguish circumstances when the statute of frauds applies
- Determine when digital signatures are permitted vs. not
- Determine when data privacy requirements apply to businesses
- Differentiate between the various forms of dispute resolution
